# **Report from our first AGM**

It was good to see everyone who turned out to our first AGM in October.

Green Ixworth's **River project** provided the focus for the meeting with our speakers shedding greater light on both the wider catchment and the fine detail of the health of our water. Our advertised speaker, Will Cranstoun from Suffolk Wildlife Trust, was unable to be with us but we were very fortunate that Ian Hawkins, the East Anglian trainer for the *River Fly Trust* and Ellie Beach the coordinator for the local *Little Ouse Headwaters Project* (LOHP) ably stepped into the breach.

Both expressed interest in our draft Vision for the Black Bourn here in Ixworth and both are working with the *Suffolk Wildlife Trust* and *CamEO* the river basin project for the Cam, Ouse and Little Ouse and the Thet sponsored by *Anglian Water* and the *Rivers Trust*.

lan's area of expertise with *River Fly* is in identification of flying insects living most of their life in the river and whose presence are an indication of water quality. Ian and his colleague from Pakenham have offered to provide us with training to do this work. The initial training will be online with practical training taking place in the spring, funded by *CamEO*.

Ellie gave a fascinating history of *LOHP* which has progressed from a group of enthusiasts tidying odd pieces of fenland to an organisation which now owns and leases fenland along the river from the source at Redgrave to Hopton. It has successfully raise funding to achieve this. It gave many of us food for thought and the opportunity to think bigger than we have so far particularly as it seems that there are funds widely available for well considered projects.

Supporters of our river project were present from Bardwell, Badwell Ash and Pakenham all of whom seem to be looking for the similar things as us and searching for others to work with.

# **Crown Lane Wilding Project**

We will be looking for help to thicken planting along the Crown Lane footpath which we laid down last winter. We are currently awaiting delivery of trees which appears to be delayed this year by the lack of serious frost. This project has been supported with funding from the West Suffolk Localities Fund.

We are especially delighted that Eagle Class from Ixworth Primary School have offered their help with the planting following a study they carried out earlier this term into Climate Change. Once we have a delivery date we shall put out a call for volunteers to help the children with this work.

# **Black Bourn Update**

The Black Bourn Vision document has gone down well. It is encouraging to learn that up and down the river people are looking for local action and wanting to link with others.

We have also requested details from Anglian Water about their £300m plans for expenditure on our river basin. They have already notified/consulted with the bigger Riparian owners. #### Hempyard Bridge

Work to repair the 500 year old Hempyard Bridge is currently at planning application stage. Repair of this bridge is long overdue, however some issues of concern have been identified by Green Ixworth members. Firstly ensuring that the river bed is cleared of any debris created during the works and carefully reinstated; that potential damage to nearby trees during the works is prohibited and that the design proposal to introduce a wooden fence ,nearly 2m high, to be built into the bridge to protect horse riders is removed.

These concerns are outlined in the Objection to the application (The reference is DC/21/3043/LB) submitted by Roger which is available on the West Suffolk Planning site or greenixworth.org.uk. If you wish to let the planners know what you think of this design email: <u>planning.technical@westsuffolk.gov.uk</u>. The opportunity to submit will close soon.
